DRIVING CIRCULARITY IN FASHION THROUGH EDUCATION 2021 edition of open-access Redress Design Award Pathway Course now opens for registration

[10th December 2020, Hong Kong] Organised by environmental NGO Redress with Create Hong Kong of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region as the Lead Sponsor, the world's largest sustainable fashion design competition, the Redress Design Award proudly celebrates a decade of education to drive circularity in the fashion system with a report on its educational impact, including some 50,000 individuals reached through its activities across the years.

The Redress Design Award additionally kicks off its 2021 competition cycle with an exciting new edition of its Pathway Course, a two-week circular and sustainable fashion design curriculum free to all designers and now open for registration.

Redress Founder Christina Dean notes, "The Redress Design Award is recognised for identifying talent and producing a global pool of sustainably-minded designers, yet the backbone of this programme is actually its extensive educational platform, which reaches thousands more designers than the star finalists that the world gets to see. We know that a shift in education is critical to transforming the fashion industry: without knowledgeable professionals entering the market, a sustainable future for fashion has a tougher challenge."

For the 2021 award cycle, the Redress Design Award welcomes new Education Partner Avery Dennison, who will provide key expertise to audiences across a range of activities on technology's role in developing solutions for circular fashion.

OPEN-ACCESS CIRCULAR DESIGN COURSE LAUNCHES SECOND EDITION

Following the success of its 2020 launch, the Redress Design Award 2021 Pathway Course is the second edition of the competition's informative online short curriculum. Created to support emerging designers in deepening their knowledge of circular fashion design strategies and techniques, this informative course aims to give them an edge in both the Redress Design Award competition and the fast-changing fashion industry.

Free and open to all, the Redress Design Award Pathway Course is divided into four one-hour sessions across a two-week schedule, 15th - 26th January 2021. Each session is rich in practical tips and delivered by leading industry experts from, among others, the Hong Kong Research Institute of Textile and Apparel, Fashion For Good, Avery Dennison, SGS, and Browzwear. The educational content spans a range of circular design topics, from designing for low waste, sourcing and manufacturing, to harnessing innovation.



CELEBRATING ACHIEVEMENTS IN EDUCATION

The Education Impact Report reflects on the critical work that the Redress Design Award has delivered across the last 10 cycles. Working to equip the next generation of fashion professionals with the knowledge and tools to transform the fashion industry, the education facet of the award programme is core to its success. As such, designers in more than 55 countries and regions have benefitted from the Award's various levels of engagement, from self-led learning via open-access resources, to tailored workshops, academies and immersive industry experiences.

The unique approach of the programme has led to many extended opportunities for educational impact, including close relationships with selected universities to deliver content directly to students across the globe; consultations with IFA Paris (France) and the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (Hong Kong) on Fashion Sustainability curricula; and the integration of educational content into courses at multiple academic institutions.
